Editorial

Dartmouth Road Tragedy

It is with great sadness that I heard of the second fatality in recent months at the busy junction of **Dartmouth Road** with **Greenway Road**. My deepest sympathies go to family and friends.

Perhaps now the authorities will heed local residents regarding the safety of **Dartmouth Road**. Locals are puzzled by the reduction to **30-mph** on the stretch from **Goodrington** to **Churston Library**, with only one crossroads. Whereas, the section from **Galmpton Common** to **Churston Cross**, with at least **7** junctions and numerous business entrances, remains at **40-mph**. They also do not understand why the **Park & Ride** site needs traffic lights, but the **Greenway Road** junction does not.

Surely this part of **Dartmouth Road** has to be **30-mph** and the **Greenway Road** junction needs lights. At the same time parts of **Bascombe Road** and **Galmpton Village** must be **20-mph** to deter them becoming rat runs.

Galmpton Floral Day ~ A Celebration of Skills Sunday September 9th 2007

The sun shone, the floral bunting fluttered, skills were celebrated, and all the Shows had record entries. The **Plant Stall** hummed, the **Pantry Stall** sold out, the **Demonstrations** fascinated, the **Barn Chapel's** flowers and music enchanted, and the **Refreshment Team** was worked off their feet!

People came from far and wide and if you were not one of them you missed a really good day with a strong community feel. Its success was that it was all about people meeting, talking, sharing, displaying, and admiring skills, while enjoying themselves in a gentle way. You cannot quantify such a success, but if you want to talk in numbers everything was up on last year.

What a Wonderful Day!

Overall **Show Entries** were up by **50%**, the **Plant Stall** raised £302 against £264 last year, the **Pantry Stall** £130 against £90, and £214 pounds worth of **Refreshments** were consumed which all points to an increase in visitor numbers. The takings for the day came to £1149.78, and if you add to this the £524 taken on the **Open Gardens** day in June, the total for **Galmpton Floral Day 2007** stands at £1674.78. That is £245 up on **2006** and this without the **Words & Music** event that has moved to pre-Christmas.

Expenses run at about £650 and there is the need to keep back a sum to kick-start **2008** as well as money to further develop the **Galmpton Floral Project**. The **Working Party** will have met in October to decide where in the Village to allocate the surplus funds.





New Headteacher Mr Robert Owers

I attended a mixed comprehensive in the **London Borough of Havering**. Played every sport available and was *inspired* by two history teachers. I studied history at **Warwick University** and qualified to teach History & PE at **Hull University**. I continued my commitment to learning by gaining a **Certificate of FE Studies** from **Cambridge University** and an **NPQH**. I taught in two large mixed comprehensive schools in **Essex** before moving to be **Deputy Headteacher** at **Chelmsford County High School for Girls**. My background in the selective and non-selective sector has strengthened my commitment to a community based grammar school education.

Developing the Leaders of Tomorrow

Churston Ferrers is already a highly successful grammar school and gives me the opportunity to use my first few months as a period of *acquaintance*.

I believe grammar school education should be a much-cherished *privilege*. However with this privilege comes responsibility. It is the responsibility of the school to allow the students to develop to their full potential.

In short, I want our school to prepare students to lead fulfilled, responsible, and happy lives, through an excellent education, the ability to be a flexible learner, and leadership qualities that will enable them to *make a difference*.

Why Computers Sometimes Crash ©



Traffic Calming Galmpton Gateways Comments Please

The GRA campaign for a 20-mph village speed limit has been rejected by Torbay Council, despite a 400-signature petition. Just two streets in Torbay have been designated 20-mph in the last 10 years! Road safety is one of our major concerns, especially relevant after two tragic fatalities at the Greenway Road and Dartmouth Road Junction, in the last 6 months.

Torbay Council have now suggested an alternative plan; the installation of six brand new "*Minimally Invasive Traffic Calming Gateways*" at village entrances (see plan below). Further details, including the siting of the new Gateways can be found on our website **www.galmptontorbay.org.uk**.


We understand that people living close to these gateways may be affected by some noise disturbance from cars driving over the textured surface.

Dart View Road & Hill Rise Development

During **August** there has been a lot of movement on the site at Galmpton.

We have laid foundations, floor beams, and scaffolding in preparation for timber frame installation of 2 semi-detached houses and 6 flats in **Hill Rise**. These are part of the development of the **Dart View Road & Hill Rise** site. Soil removal is currently taking place in the **Dart View Road** area.

In **September** we shall be looking to place the floor beams and preparation works for the last 6 timber frame flats.

There have been a large number of heavy construction vehicles coming and going from the site, which have probably caused some inconvenience, but have largely gone unnoticed, for which we thank the Galmpton community.

We are now placing the first stages of timber frame construction, which will take approximately 4 weeks for the 8 units. Following this, it should take another 6 weeks to complete the major part of the development. The anticipated date for completion will still be towards the end of **January**.





HOME INFORMATION PACKS UP-DATE & ENERGY PERFORMANCE CERTIFICATES





The widely publicised **Home Information Pack** (**HIP**) now has to be prepared for any property with three or more bedrooms when it is placed on the market for sale. Properties with one or two bedrooms, we understand, are soon to be included within the legislation as well.

One of the documents that a **HIP** must include is an **Energy Performance Certificate** (**EPC**) prepared by an accredited **Domestic Energy Assessor**.

HIP UP-DATE & EPC (Continued)

This all sounds terribly complicated, but in reality it is all very simple. As well as the traditional role of the estate agent visiting your property to prepare the sales brochure with measurements, floor plans and photos, a further short visit is made by one of our energy assessors, **Annette Bye** or **Vanessa Ripley**, to gather the information needed to prepare the **EPC**. The certificate rates energy efficiency based on fuel costs and floor area of the property.

The full certificate & report then forms part of the **Home Information Pack**. In addition the **EPC** graph, an example of which is shown opposite, is also included in the traditional sales brochure.

One graph shows the current energy efficiency and a level of energy efficiency, which could be achieved by carrying out some improvements. The other graph shows the environmental impact of the property and the reduction, which could be achieved. Often relatively minor and inexpensive improvements, such as fitting low-energy light bulbs in all the fixed lighting points, can result in improvements of several points.

The thrust behind the **Energy Performance Certificate** is to make people more aware of the impact their homes have on the environment, and to show ways in which the energy efficiency can be improved, with the resultant reduction in energy consumption, and therefore lower bills for gas and electricity.


