Dart View & Hill Rise Development Officially Open

On Thurs 3rd April, Riviera Housing & Connaught Partnerships hosted a completion ceremony to declare the 12 flats and 2 houses officially open. Residents from the area were invited to tour some of the empty properties, and share in afternoon tea with incoming occupants. All the properties are now signed-up and we welcome the occupiers to Galmpton.

Brian Armour, Resources Director, stated in his welcoming speech that the development cost £1.2 M, provided by a Government Grant (£500 K), Torbay Council (£200 K), Riviera Housing (£200 K), and a loan from the Nationwide (£300 K). He thanked Keith Murray and Neil Leggett and the rest of Connaught Partnerships for completing the works on time despite the bad weather and vandalism they had suffered.

Brian formally named the flats as **Soper House** and **Nelson House**, which are in memory of staff who recently passed away. He said that **Riviera** built houses, but the residents made them homes, and seeing these properties on a beautiful day, with such glorious views, was a dream come true.

He reminded residents that if there were any problems, they should contact either **Elisabeth Fisher** or **Richard Keith** of the **Neighbourhood Team**.

One of the new residents, **Paul Burns**, then cut the ceremonial ribbon to declare the development well and truly open!

AGM held on 27th March 2008

We had a good turn out to the **GRA AGM**. It has been a very busy year, and attendees were given details of the work that the committee has been involved in over the last 12 months. Undoubtedly the biggest issues for discussion were the **Windy Corner** road-widening scheme, pedestrian safety in the village, speed limits, and traffic lights at Greenway Road or Manor Vale.

We were pleased to hear that those attending were so supportive of the work the (voluntary) **Committee** is doing on your behalf.

Committee Re-election

Gordon Batten, Paul Crocker, and Peter Royle were duly re-appointed respectively to the roles of Convenor, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Unfortunately, we are still without a **Chairman**. **Gordon** has done a superb job in covering the role and will continue to do so this year.

Margaret Packer, Richard & Helen Boyles, Delia Hales, Steve Davies, Christine Batten (Minutes Secretary), and Paul Savin (Webmaster) will continue as Committee members.

Finances

The **Accounts** were approved. The association accounts are in a healthy position. **Peter Royle** reported the favourable financial position of the **GRA** accounts and encouraged anyone who has not yet paid their £2 household subscription to hand this into **Gary Deare** at the **Galmpton Post Office**.

We might have to seek voluntary contributions to fight the **Windy Corner** plans.

20-mph Village Speed Limit

The **Council** will undertake a review of the appropriateness of speed limits in **Galmpton** at some stage in the next **12 months**. We are hoping that the **Council** will take into account the evidence we have provided to get the speed limit reduced to **20-mph**.

Galmpton Residents' Association News Windy Corner

Unfortunately, the **Torbay Council** has approved progression of the **Windy Corner** traffic proposals (**Option A**). The plan is to widen the filter lane (for traffic travelling from Brixham) to speed up traffic and reduce congestion, build a cycle lane across the common, and move the bus stop further back towards the Brixham side of the common. All of this development will mean a considerable loss of **Common** land.

The **Councillors** on the **Transportation Committee** have chosen to ignore our arguments. Firstly, that this is not permitted under the deeds of transfer & covenant, and will ruin the common. Secondly, that the increased speed will make the **Langdon Lane** junction even more dangerous to navigate, which could result in more serious accidents and fatalities, both here and at other nearby junctions along **Dartmouth Road**.

The **Council** must apply to the **Government** to request that ownership be transferred to them. They acknowledge this may take 4 - 7 years to resolve due to the complexity of the legal issues affecting the use of the **Common**.

We intend opposing this and will need additional legal input, which is not cheap. We therefore may need to seek additional funding from **Residents** to help the fighting fund.

Thank you to everyone who attended the hearing and who wrote in to the **Council** opposing this plan and to the many who have contacted us. We will need to keep campaigning in the coming months and years, to ensure the **Common** remains unspoilt, and road safety is not compromised.

You may have seen in a recent **Herald Express** article on the subject what a **Brixham Councillor** who attended the **Transportation Committee** told the **Herald**. He suggested the residents of **Galmpton** are being "**Selfish**" in not handing the land over without a fight, and considered the **Common** of little value as it was only used by a few people to walk their dogs!

Report of AGM held on Monday 31st March

The **Chairman** reported that income was still buoyant, largely due to the **Pre-School**, and that the main expenditure on internal redecoration and new lighting had been money well spent.

Thanks go to **Bryan Helley** and **Michael Pook** for a job superbly done.

We would also like to thank **Connaught Partnerships Ltd** for re-pointing the front wall outside the village hall, as a gift to the community.

A **Fire Safety Training** session was held in **March**, so that users of the hall are familiar with the operation of fire alarms, fire extinguishers, etc.

The **Treasurer**, **Philip Griffin**, reported that the accounts showed a small annual deficit of £489.78 mainly due to the continued hall maintenance.

We thank those who have donated gifts to the Village Institute coffers, in particular £500 from the Floral Days, £275 from the Women's Institute, £200 from the estate of Phyllis Holmes, together with contributions from the Whist Group, and the Gooseberry Pie Fair.

The **Chairman** and **Secretary** were re-elected for another year. However, after five years as **Treasurer**, **Philip** decided not to stand for re-election, and so **Lisa Edey** was elected in his place.

Report of Committee Meeting held following AGM

The maintenance of the hall continues this summer with the refurbishment of the **Kitchen** at a cost of approximately £7,000. This work means that the **Village Hall will be CLOSED from Sat 26th July until Sun 31st August**.

The charges for the hall have not increased for several years. Meanwhile, inflation and maintenance keep diminishing our funds. So we have decided to increase charges from **Monday 1**st **September** to **£9.50 per hour** for the whole hall, and **£4.75 per hour** for half the hall.

We've delayed incorporation until **Charitable Incorporated Organisations (CIO)** are legalised, which offer us more favourable terms of business.

We are always keen to attract new members to the committee, to continue the management of one of the most important resources within the village. If you are interested, then please contact any committee member, or simply come along to a committee meeting.




