This entitles the holder to a return trip for **£4**, but some trains are excluded. The **Rover Ticket** must be obtained from **Queens Park Station, Paignton**, where proof of residency, such as a utility bill, is needed. You may be unaware that heavily discounted books of **Dartmouth Ferry** tickets are on offer. Both vehicle and foot passenger concessions can be purchased on board the ferry. Each book contains **40** single journey tickets. A foot passenger book for the **Lower Ferry** cost me only **£20** last time.



Report of Committee Meeting held on Thursday 3rd July

The new **Treasurer, Lisa Edey**, reported that she wanted to streamline the invoicing process, and eliminate some anomalies inherited from the past.

These will be introduced with the increase in charges from **1st September** to **£9.50 per hour** for the whole hall, and **£4.75 per hour** for half the hall.

We have delayed incorporation into a Company Limited by Guarantee until **Charitable Incorporated Organisations** are legalised, which offer more favourable terms of business. However, the timetable for this has been put back, so we just have to be patient.

The maintenance of the hall continues this summer with the refurbishment of the **Kitchen** at a cost of approximately **£7,000**. This work means that the **Village Hall will be CLOSED from Sat 26th July until Tue 2nd September**, although a few clubs may continue to use the (dusty) hall in the evenings.

The next committee meeting will be at **7:30 pm** on **Monday 6th October**.

News From Your Conservative Ward Councillors


These are some of the issues we have worked on since our last newsletter.

- We successfully stopped the large sign, advertising the regeneration programme in Brixham, from being sited on the Common.
- Signage for the new 'gateways' in Galmpton has been ordered, and should be installed in the early Autumn. It is likely that the imprint rumble strips will be installed as part of a larger programme, as this work has to be carried out by a specialist contractor.
- A survey is being conducted this summer by our Highways team, into extending the 30-mph speed limit to beyond Churston Cross.
- We were both involved at the Town Hall in saving the green spaces at Hookhills.
- Once again, we managed to assist in removing the travellers from both Commons as quickly as legislation permits, and we shall be campaigning for larger boulders/barriers to stop vehicular access on to the Commons.

Reminder: We will **not** be holding an advice surgery in **August**, but if anyone does have any issues they wish to raise, we do normally hold our surgeries on the **first Saturday** of each month from **10:00 am to 12 noon** at **Churston Library**. No appointment is necessary, and all are welcome.

Dear residents and friends; It has been a busy 3 months, and we have lots of news; some good, some not so good.

Travellers - How do we protect Warborough Common ?

We have been inundated with comments from residents, from both **Galmpton** and **Churston**, about the recent influx of **Travellers** in the area. During this time, we have been liaising with the **Police**, **Torbay Council** & the **Mayor** on the matter, and were pleased to see the **Travellers** leave relatively quickly following swift co-ordinated **Council** and **Police** action.

The subsequent clean-up operation and various alleged criminal activities, as reported in the **Herald Express**, reinforces the importance of better protection on **Warborough Common** and surrounding areas.

We are, again, pursuing the issue of more substantial physical protection on the **Common's** boundaries and the **Mayor** is keen to hear our views. The **Police** tell us that wooden stakes get chain-sawed down and rocks get dragged off by chains attached to lorries. Therefore any protection is going to have to be substantial. We have received suggestions of earth banks, concrete posts and chains, or metal fences?

We'd be keen to know if residents would feel happy with a more substantial fence / level of protection, or will this destroy the character of the area? All ideas gratefully accepted.

Torbay Council Reject GRA Plea for Traffic Lights

Despite our relentless attempts to get **Torbay Council** to install traffic lights and a pedestrian crossing on the Dartmouth Road/Greenway Road junction (or Manor Vale junction), we have just been informed by the **Highways** team, that the **Council** will not be installing traffic signals at this time.

Incredibly, they say this is because ***there have not been enough injury-related accidents at the junction*** (2 fatalities aren't enough!) In their view, the junction has good visibility and traffic flow into the junction is not heavy enough to justify lights. In addition, they believe the lights will interfere with the free flow of traffic along the Dartmouth Road.

The GRA shall continue our fight on your behalf.

Windy Corner - Road Widening Update

Our campaign to prevent the road widening on the **Common** is gaining momentum. We are in the process of collecting and collating evidence ready for the inevitable public enquiry.

A few residents have commented that, the proposed road widening and cycle track on the **Common** would provide an ideal access road for future **Travellers**, onto the **Common** from **Dartmouth Road**. In addition the ground between the road and the new cycle path would be just wide enough to park **Traveller's** vehicles.

Traffic Calming Gateways

Some good news; Funding for this has been secured by the **Council** for the current financial year, and we understand that signage for the **Gateways** will be erected in the “**next few months**”. The carriageway changes will take slightly longer to organise, but completion is due by **March 2009**.

We have been refused flashing speeding signs. The local **Council** is only funding four across the whole bay, at sites with worse speeding records than **Galmpton**. However, our name remains on the waiting list!

20-mph Village Centre Speed Limit Review

We want to increase the profile of our **20-mph** campaign in preparation for this review later in the financial year. We thought a “**20-mph for Galmpton**” type car sticker could be produced to publicise this. We'd sell these for say **£2.00** a time to raise more funds for the campaign. **We'd be pleased to hear your views on whether you think this is a good idea?**

Youth Hostel Association Coaches

Thanks to those who have reported continuing road safety problems with large coaches in the village going to and from the **Youth Hostel**. It appears there are about 6 trips a day, there and back, along the narrow lanes. This is causing a major road safety issue. We are working with our colleagues at **Maypool Residents Association** and liaising with both **South Hams** and **Devon County Council** to request a restriction on the size of vehicles using the lane.

Warborough Common - Removal of Goal Posts

We understand that **Council** workmen recently removed the goal posts (before the arrival of travellers) much to the disappointment of the local children and we are making enquiries as to when they will be replaced.


