Those of you who have not been with us since **Issue 1** may be unaware of the ethos behind **THE GAZETTE**.

My wife, Beryl, and I moved to Devon from Essex in 2003. We chose the area because of its stunning scenery and characterful towns, but mostly because Galmpton echoed the strong community of our village in Essex.

We soon found how right we were, with active organisations and charitable events galore. But people we met in Churston, Broadsands, and beyond, were often unaware of such events, or heard of them too late to take part.

Then it dawned on me what was missing. In Essex our village had a parish magazine, but Galmpton did not. So I approached local organisations, to see if they would sponsor such an enterprise, just to cover printing costs. The response was so positive that in spring 2006 *THE GAZETTE* was born.

I devote my time as **Editor** for free, volunteers deliver your magazine, and many of the contributors write articles or newsletters for each edition at their own expense. The objective is to encourage a community spirit.

Increased Charges

The end of Galmpton Residents Association?

- Do you enjoy reading our regular newsletters keeping you informed on how we are trying to protect village life?
- Do you value our regular E-mail alerts notifying you of controversial issues, Council decisions, and planning applications that adversely affect the village?

If your answer is "yes" to these questions, can I ask you to consider how **Galmpton** village would fare if the **GRA** had to disband, and there was no effective, independent, campaign group looking after the village?

Unfortunately, that is the position we are currently in. However, unfortunately, **Gordon** has had to resign this role following 18-months of sterling service to the **GRA**. We are pleased he will still remain as a regular Committee member.

Never has the time been so important to build up the strength of the **GRA** Committee as we continue our campaigns on:

- Protecting the common.
- Reducing large-scale house building on the village borders.
- Improving road safety in the village.

All of the work that we do is voluntary, and is undertaken by a group of dedicated individuals on the **GRA** Committee. However, we urgently need more help, and would welcome anyone contacting us who would be interested in taking on the role of Chairman, or anyone who would be interested in joining the Committee.

Travellers ~ Feedback on protecting Warborough Common

Thank you to the 26, or so, residents who responded with suggestions to protect the **Common** from another traveller invasion. By far the two most equally popular ideas were:

- Turfed-up low earth bank with tree plantings.
- Wooden fences.

Other suggestions included chain fence, trenches, more wooden posts, and large, concreted-in boulders. Two residents opted to leave the common as it was and resort to the legal powers that exist to clear the site.

Some comments, whilst amusing, cannot be published!

We will feed the popular comments back to **Torbay Council** and see what their response is.

Traffic lights on Dartmouth Rd ~ Road traffic accidents

It has been 12 months since the last fatality. As reported in **THE GAZETTE**, **Torbay Council** needs more accidents to happen on this stretch of road (along with other criteria to be met) before they can apply to central government for funding for traffic lights sighted at either **Greenway Road** or **Manor Vale Road**.

Sadly and predictably we have been informed by a resident that there was a further serious motorcycle accident in **August**, but on this occasion at the **Dartmouth Road / Manor Vale Road** junction.

At the current accident rate, we should meet the criteria for traffic lights in **2012**. Sad but true!

The GRA will continue its fight on your behalf.

Windy Corner ~ Road Widening

We have obtained a significant amount of material from **Torbay Council** under the **Freedom of Information Act** to help our campaign to challenge the road building on the **Common**. Our preparations continue.

Maypool YHA Coaches

Following letters of opposition from residents of **Galmpton** and **Maypool**, and from the respective **Residents' Associations**, we have been informed that **South Hams Council** has revoked the planning permission for the temporary use of the **YHA**.

This has had the immediate benefit that coaches going to and from the centre have stopped, and the lanes are again safer for pedestrians, cyclists, horse riders, and motorists.

15,000 new houses in Torbay?

It is not often that we report that we are fully supporting the local Council!

However, **Galmpton** residents may have seen our mail shots dropped through their doors, and subsequent **Herald Express** coverage. These explained that we are joining with other **Residents' Associations** and **Parish Councils** at **Stoke Gabriel**, **Yalberton**, **Collaton St Mary**, **Blagdon**, and **Marldon** to publicise the fact that the central government's **Regional Spatial Strategy** targets a further **15,000** houses to be built in **Torbay** by **2026**. This means that **7,500** houses need to be built on green fields West of **Torbay**, mainly between **Marldon** & **Galmpton**. This would destroy the landscape, damage the tourist industry, overload community services, and swamp the ring road with **12-15,000** extra local cars.

We are advised that if enough residents complain, we could reduce this to **10,000** houses. Still not ideal, we know, but better than **15,000**, and more than matching the population growth rate over the last **30** years. The majority of the extra new houses could then be absorbed into the urban area, which is the Council's preferred plan.

By the time you read this, you should have already received instructions on how to register an objection if you feel you want to help us reduce the number of houses. A large public meeting resulted in hundreds of objection forms being signed for despatch to the **Government's Office for the South West (GOSW)**.

This is the first stage of campaigning. If the numbers of houses are reduced, we will then concentrate efforts to persuade **Torbay Council** to build the houses in areas least damaging to the countryside, and served by a better transport infrastructure, so as to reduce the chances of **Torbay** grinding to a halt through gridlock.

20-mph Village Centre Speed Limit

We asked for feedback, in *THE GAZETTE*, on whether you thought it was a good idea to produce a "20-mph for Galmpton" type car sticker, to be sold for say £2.00, to both publicise our campaign and raise **GRA** funds. Unfortunately there has been very little interest, so we are going to drop this idea, and continue to campaign with the Council directly.

GRA Subscriptions Due

We have been collecting **GRA** subscriptions in September & October 2008. We froze the rate at the very reasonable cost of just **£2.00** per household. Please support the work we do by paying your subscription and joining us. Thank you **Peter Royle**, our Treasurer, for organising the collection and to all the volunteer collectors who do a fantastic job, every year.

New Plans for Skate-Park Site

In view of the declining use of the skate-park, and because of the financial cost of maintaining the equipment, **Helen Boyles**, Trustee on the Galmpton War Memorial Playing Fields Committee has, with the agreement of the Treasurer, **Ian Smaller**, decided to give over its management to **Churston Ferrers Grammar School**. This was done on the understanding that it should still be reserved for the use of young people, but could be adapted to serve a more popular recreational purpose. After a consultation with students on the **School Committee**, it has been decided to convert it to a basket ball court at a time convenient to all, probably within the next six months. Since no other ideas were proposed in response to the last request for suggestions in **THE GAZETTE**, we have accepted this plan. **Wanted Properties** have kindly agreed to help to dismantle the mini-ramp when required, so if anyone wants to use it, make the most of it, because it is not going to be around for much longer!

Many thanks indeed go to everyone who has supported this project from the village through such events as the **Gooseberry Pie Fair**. Particular thanks to **Caroline Swanton** (**Langworthy**) for devoting so much time and effort to organising tombolas for this event. Everyone's combined efforts and support has been greatly appreciated. The young people who have been involved in the fund-raising have gained much from the experience, which, for some, has contributed to **Duke of Edinburgh** awards.

It seems odd to be sitting here in September, with the thoughts of harvest and flower festivals still fresh in my mind, and to be writing about Christmas and New Year. Still, even now, there are decorations and cards appearing in shops; so perhaps we in the Church (who first started the Christmas celebration) should not be so slow off the mark.

Look at how different Gospel writers preface their accounts of Jesus' life. Matthew begins by referring to Abraham (about 2000 BC). Mark's first reference is to Isaiah (about 500 BC). Luke begins by telling us of the birth of John the Baptist - only shortly before the birth of Jesus - but then goes on to give us Jesus' family tree, which he traces back to Adam and Eve. John goes back even further, to the beginning of time itself, and before.

God clearly put a lot of time into preparing us for the coming of His son, Jesus. He wanted us to be ready so we would appreciate what a wonderful gift he was giving us. Despite this when Mary came to give birth she had to use a cattle shed (as we all know) because there was no room in the inn.

Getting ready to celebrate the coming of Jesus was not about material preparation; it was about spiritual preparation. It was about realising our weakness as humans and recognising the almighty love that God has for us. That involves us in being truthful with God and ourselves and admitting that we sometimes get it wrong and so need to say sorry. That also means recognising how we often take things for granted and fail to realise that all we have comes from God.

The Church takes this seriously and so in the weeks before Christmas we have the season of Advent, in which we look at how God prepared people for Jesus' birth all those years ago and how we are preparing ourselves for his next visit, when he will come to judge the world he died to save.

So, as you prepare your house and larder for the coming of Christmas try asking yourself, "Are my heart and soul ready to receive the Lord who came at Christmas to bring God's love?" Then think about beating the last minute Christmas rush by coming to Church now.

INHERITANCE TAX

IS THIS AN OPTIONAL TAX YOU WILL HAVE TO PAY?

Inheritance tax is often described as the 'optional tax' as with planning it can be reduced or even deflected entirely. If you die and the value of your estate - all your possessions, including your home, its contents, your car and your savings (minus any debts) - is more than £312,000 this tax year (2008/09), everything you have to leave above that limit could be liable for tax at 40 per cent.

Married couples and civil partners can pool their IHT allowance, so that when one dies, their estate is passed on free of IHT to their partner. When the second person dies, the estate is passed on with the first £624,000 IHT free

IHT CHECKLIST

- 1. It is crucial that you write a will. If you die without one and have no family, everything goes to the State.
- Try to reduce the value of your estate for IHT purposes. Money given to family or friends in your lifetime can fall outside the IHT net, but you have to plan early. If you live for at least seven years after making such a gift, the beneficiaries should not have to pay IHT on it.
- 3. Certain other cash gifts up to £5,000 for a wedding or civil partnership present, all charitable donations and £3,000 given away each year to any individual are also exempt. You can also make any number of small gifts of £250 or less a year.
- 4. If you don't use your annual allowance, it carries forward for one year only, so you could gift up to £6,000 this year free of IHT, assuming you have not used any of your allowance from last year.
- 5. Write your investments and life insurance in an appropriate trust. This means your money is technically outside your estate and is not IHT liable. The trust can allow someone to receive a legacy in a controlled way for example, the recipient may inherit only at a certain age. Gifting investments into a trust can also take seven years for the value to fall outside of the estate, and certain trust gifts over the nil-rate band may give rise to an immediate liability.

In Case of Emergency (ICE)

We all carry our mobile phones with names & numbers stored in memory, but nobody, other than ourselves, knows which of these numbers belongs to our closest family or friends. If we were to be involved in an accident or became ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone, but would not know whom to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored, but which one is the contact person - in case of an emergency? Hence, this **ICE** (In Case of Emergency) campaign.


