The Government has decided to grant **Post Office Ltd** a new contract for the post office card account (**POCA**), which will run to **2015** with a possible **5** year extension to **2020**. Up and down the country there are four million customers with these accounts, who make **6.5 million** visits per week to a post office and spend **£2bn** a year in the local shops. Hopefully, post offices can now build new business from having a solid platform for the first time in many years.

Skate-Park Update

Where do we go from here?

Contrary to the impression given in the last **Skate-Park** update, owing to financial pressures, **Churston Ferrers Grammar School** is no longer in a position to take over the management of the **Skate-Park** facility and adapt it to a basketball court. So plans for its future use are currently suspended.

The **Galmpton Youth Project** would like to ensure that the funds raised over the past few years to provide and maintain this facility are preserved for its exclusive use. So we are considering using some of these funds for a temporary refurbishment to extend its useful life and make it available again to the young people for whom it was designed. This proposal will be made at the next meeting of the **Churston Pavilion Playing Field Committee**.

Until this is possible, the facility will unfortunately have to stay closed.

In the meantime, **GYP** would be grateful for any help or suggestions on how the park might best be managed and maintained, or whether you think there is insufficient demand for the facility to justify this effort.

Galmpton Residents' Association ~ Chair

In the last edition of *THE GAZETTE*, we asked for expressions of interest to fill the role of **GRA Chair**. Unfortunately, there was a very disappointing response, and the **GRA** now has to consider scaling down its operations. We still have an active committee, and we plan to share out responsibility for key campaigns. This means that smaller issues may have to be dropped or issues may not progress as fast and as far as we would have hoped.

If you would like to help us, we would love to hear from you.

Due to these problems, we have not yet arranged any **2009** committee meetings, nor have we finalised a date for the **AGM**. These dates will be published on the website when available.

Dartmouth Road ~ Speed Limit Review

Torbay Council is conducting a review of the **40-mph** speed limit between the **Windy Corner** and **Brixham**. Many residents encounter difficulties and dangers using or crossing this road, and accessing the junctions as drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists. The traffic flows too quickly for safe manoeuvring. Sadly this has resulted in two recent fatalities, with no tangible response to representations by **GRA** and others for safety improvements.

At **New Year**, with less than **10** days notice, the **Highways Department**, as part of their review, invited comments from residents on an appropriate speed limit based on their experiences. Because of the very short notice, we E-mailed the message to our members. The **GRA** will be reiterating our previous suggestion for a **30-mph** speed limit on the **Dartmouth Road**, together with traffic lights and junction improvements at the junctions to either **Greenway Road** or **Manor Vale Road**.

We'd encourage you to also write in to the **Council** to support the **30-mph Dartmouth Road** speed limit. Further details can be found on our website.

Windy Corner ~ Road Widening

The **Council** has submitted an application to the **Planning Inspectorate** as the first stage of acquiring **Common** land for the road building. We are currently in communication with the **Planning Inspectorate** and we will feedback further news in the next edition of **The GAZETTE**.

Travellers ~ Feedback on Protecting Warborough Common

We wrote to the **Mayor** with details of our last consultation with **Galmpton** residents, to explain that the most preferred option was the **18** to **24 inch** high *turfed-up low earth bank* surrounding the **Common**. The **Mayor** is interested in the proposal and arranged a discussion with local councillors and officers in **Jan'09**. We will report back in the next edition.

15,000 New Houses in Torbay ?

Many thanks to all who sent off pro-forma letters of opposition regarding the central government's **Regional Spatial Strategy** target, which included a proposal for a further **15,000** houses to be built in **Torbay** by **2026**.

Many hundreds of forms were sent locally, and by our **Torbay** neighbours. The **Regional Spatial Strategy** not only affects **Torbay** but also the whole **South West**. We expected the **SW Government Office** to reply by **Jan'09**.

However, we understand from a **Herald Express** article, in early **Dec'08**, that the strategy was met with equal concern right across the **South West**. The article said over **25,000** letters / comments forms were received, and that a decision on this initiative is to be postponed until **Summer 2009**. We hope that sense will prevail, our constructive comments will be taken into account, and house building will be reduced to meet the current infrastructure.

Galmpton ~ Analogue TV Signal Switch-off

Some elderly residents have been in contact regarding the switch-off of the analogue TV signal in **Galmpton** starting in **April'09**. You must act now if your TV can only receive the four analogue stations of **BBC1**, **BBC2**, **ITV1** and **Channel 4**, as you will not be able to receive them soon.

Reception is poor in some parts of the village and we recommend anyone who is unsure how this will affect them, either to call the national help-line **08456 505050** or to visit **www.digitaluk.co.uk** urgently to seek advice.

Maypool ~ YHA Large Coaches

We reported in the last edition of *The GAZETTE* that **South Hams Council** had revoked planning permission for the temporary use of the **YHA**. This has reduced the number but not eliminated large coaches using the lane, and still causes road safety issues. We are making further investigations.


