Editorial ~ Power to the People

Recently, the **Churston Golf Club** development has attracted increasing opposition. The **Residents Against Golf Club Sell-off** (**RAGS**) has been formed as a dedicated lobby group to thwart the proposals, and the existing **Churston, Galmpton & Broadsands Community Partnership** has also declared that it is opposed to the scheme. You can read reports from both organisations later in this issue, and visit their websites for the latest news. If you don't have a PC, then go to Churston Library and use theirs.

It appears that discussions have been ongoing between **Torbay Council**, the housing developers **Marlborough/Bloors**, and the **Golf Club** for many many months, if not years. Virtually everyone now agrees that the intended site for the new clubhouse would <u>not</u> get planning permission. **Bloors** have already scaled down their proposal from **120** houses to **90** houses. Is this all a smokescreen for some hidden agenda? What is it they really want? Where do they really want to site the clubhouse? Do **Bloors** want to own the <u>whole</u> golf course? Then, **Churston Golf Club**, with plenty of cash in their pocket, could relocate to a green-field site somewhere else!

To keep abreast of the situation, and have your say, I recommend that you attend the **RAGS** and **Community Partnership** public meetings. There are many aspects of the development that may have a significant impact on our local environment. There is the loss of open green spaces, the potential traffic congestion and associated dangers, the strain placed on community services such as doctors and schools, to name a few. These changes not only affect us, the current residents, but also our children and grandchildren who form the next generation, and the visitors to Torbay who come here because of its natural beauty. Don't sit back and just let it happen.



Guest speaker **Ian Masters** (Senior Development Surveyor at Torbay Development Agency) spoke about proposals for developing the tired facilities at **Broadsands Beach**. A straw-poll indicated that a majority felt the proposal to improve facilities was a good idea.

PC Tracy Serruys presented recent crime statistics for **Broadsands & Elbury**, and spoke about speed monitoring in **Broadsands Road**, **Dartmouth Road**, and other locations.

Ken Prichard (Chairman of Churston, Broadsands & Galmpton Community Partnership) presented an update on their activities, including the **Churston Golf Club** development, **Broadsands Beach** proposals, **Galmpton** road safety, and outcomes to the questionnaire.

BERA policy is to not mediate on residential planning applications, but always considers levels of disquiet, and potential impact upon local residents. We strive to help individuals, to articulate local concerns, and to communicate with authorities, to ensure our community gets involved in the delivery of local services and that they remain of high quality.

A vote was taken on the **Churston Golf Club** proposal. The majority voted to object to the **Golf Club** development. A letter of objection based upon existing information will be sent.

Despite concerns about the **500** bus service, positive comments indicated it was well used, enabling immobile people to get up the hill. Members were greatly in favour of the service.

Many thought the junction of **Dartmouth Road** and **Broadsands Road** was of poor design, so the Chairman agreed to write to the **Torbay Highways Department**.

Torbay Council does not rule out a **20-mph** limit in villages in the future.

In the meantime we would like to go ahead with the "20 Is Plenty" campaign.

However, we need your assistance in displaying the posters.

Do you live in the village centre, **Greenway Rd**, **Manor Vale Road**, **Langdon Lane**, or **Stoke Gabriel Road**?

Are you willing to have a campaign poster in your garden next to the road?

If you can answer **YES** to these two questions, we would like to hear from you.

We will be launching a press campaign to publicise this, and raise the profile of the campaign in early **Autumn 2010**, and the campaign will run for a fortnight.

Some areas where there is a need to slow down traffic were identified and we will E-mail GRA members to ask for comments and further suggestions.

Together with the **Community Partnership** we will be looking into the financial viability of tackling a project in the village ourselves with support from **SUSTRANS** and **Torbay Council**.

The new **Traffic Calming Gateways** appear to have had little effect on reducing speed and the lanes remain as dangerous as ever.

SAT NAV Misdirection

We have received a few communications regarding large lorries being misdirected by **Satellite Navigation** systems and getting stuck in narrow parts of **Greenway Road** and **Slade Lane**. If you have experienced similar problems please let us know, as there may be a case for traffic restrictions to be applied.

Greenway House

We have received a couple of E-mails reporting that traffic to and from **N.T. Greenway** is getting as bad as last year. Ironically it appears that there has been an increase in the numbers of visitors arriving by **Taxi**.

A **Vintage Bus Service** has also started, but it is unclear whether this is having much effect on reducing car journeys yet. We would be keen to hear your views on whether you feel the **Greenway** traffic situation is improving or worsening throughout the Summer.

Spatial Strategy Cancelled

The **GRA** committee have been informed that the new **Government** have cancelled proposals to build **20,000** new homes in the area.

Local authorities are now to set their own house building targets, based on local infrastructure and employment opportunities. The GRA led a large campaign to oppose the **Spatial Strategy** and we are pleased to hear this common sense approach has been taken.
