Editorial ~ Whatever Next!?

I think we were lulled into a false sense of security with a 30-mph limit on Dartmouth Road, Galmpton gateways, and pedestrian footways, but then...

Windy Corner Traffic Scheme

Exchange common land for a piece of verge we already have access to? This is to widen the road and speed up the traffic only recently slowed by the 30-mph limit. Galmpton and Churston residents will find it more difficult to get in and out of their villages safely, particularly at the Langdon Lane and Bascombe Road junctions.

Bloor Homes Development

They now want 90 houses, but on a greater density than the local average. Also, they plan to build a 50-apartment extra-care home for the elderly with millions of pounds of tax-payer funding. Trees with preservation orders will be felled. The extra traffic will only exacerbate our village congestion.

Churston Golf Clubhouse

The golf club want a new clubhouse to be built on an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), which also has other rural conservation orders. The access road is planned to tarmac over an historic trade route, and will only add to the local traffic misery.

Brokenbury Sports Complex

Now the Sports Council intends to build a 17 acre sports hub, with floodlit stadium, shooting range, etc. This will be sited on Bascombe Road behind the Brokenbury Water Works. More traffic chaos, noise, and light pollution!

Traffic and Parking Report

General Manager Robyn Brown offers an apology on behalf of the property, for the recent incident involving a full-size coach delivering people to Greenway. We understand this caused disruption on Greenway Road. We would like to reassure residents that the visit by the coach was unplanned. Unfortunately, they did not contact us in advance, or research access to the property. Having realised their mistake, the driver did not return to collect the two people dropped off, and they left by taxi.

This brings us neatly to another matter, of taxi traffic to and from Greenway. We have monitored numbers of taxis passing since this was raised by the GRA in the last *GAZETTE*, and are aware that there are some taxis passing to go to the Quay and Maypool, whilst some also come to Greenway. On occasion, some visitors have arrived to us by taxi, and some who have walked or come by ferry and are unable to return due to rain, time, or tiredness, have taken a taxi to leave the property. These trips do not exceed the car quota for the year.

Following consultation with the community and Kingswear and Dittisham PC's, plus our experience of opening last year, we have successfully reduced the number of cars being booked and those parking on the lane. Taxi arrivals are included with our weekly count which remains substantially below allowable levels, thanks in part to the vintage bus. As usual we have been busy in the Ward looking after the interests of our residents. These are some of the issues we have dealt with recently:

- We have received many representations both for and against the proposed development of the Churston Golf Course. These we have passed on to the appropriate departments.
- We were as surprised as you when we saw the Sports Council's proposals for the fields behind the Sewerage Works. This land has been designated for recreational use in the local plan. Not having any knowledge of this, we at once set about finding where it had all started. This is a scheme put forward by the Sports Council not the Authority. It has not been consulted on locally, nor has any lease or approval yet been given. Both your Councillors have said this scheme is "well over the top" and consultation must take place. A meeting has taken place between Councillors, Officers, and the Community Partnership to ensure full consultation takes place. This will ensure we get the right facility for that area.
- The **Gateways** for the five entrances to **Galmpton Village** have been completed. We are trying to get bulbs etc planted to enhance them.

No Way Out

Residents following the local press may have become bewildered by the amount of proposed development announced in the area in the last year. So far we have the **Bloor/Golf Course** development, housing on employment land at **White Rock** and **Roselands/Parkbay**, hundreds of houses in **Brixham**, and the latest proposal is to build a huge **17-acre** sports multipitch hub at **Brokenbury** quarry, complete with sports stadium and parking.

The **GRA** committee have great reservations that this amount of development is sustainable, as the road and social infrastructure just cannot cope. There appears to be great inconsistency between the **Torbay Council**'s Employment, Transport and Sustainability policies. We have raised our concerns with **Torbay Council Planning** and await a response.

Road Building on the Common

All **GRA** resources are now focussed on fighting the attempt by **Torbay Council** to acquire part of the **Common** to extend the filter lane and install a new bus stop.

Many thanks go to those who wrote, E-mailed, and phoned their opposition to the Council to the **Planning Inspectorate**. We will update you with news of the campaign as soon as this is available.
