

'Do you not know that in a race all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable.' 1 Corinthians ch 9 v 24-25. (ESV)

These words from Paul the Apostle were sent to the Church at Corinth, a Greek cosmopolitan city. They would have been familiar with the Olympic Games but especially with the Isthmian Games that were held near Corinth. Paul likens the Christian Life to an athletic race and this illustration would have been easily understood by them.

We start the Christian Life at the point where we recognise that we are sinners and have broken God's laws, and come to the Saviour the Lord Jesus Christ for forgiveness. Christ bore the penalty for sin when He died on the Cross and His resurrection proves the acceptance of His death as a sacrifice for sin so God can justly pardon us when we repent. God grants us a clean sheet and from then on the Christian life is like a race, which requires our diligence, discipline and determination to finish the course and receive not only eternal life but an enduring reward. As he faced imminent death, Paul wrote, 'I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved His appearing.' 2 Timothy ch 4 v7-8. (ESV)

The Brokenbury Project continues to make progress with ourselves, the Community Partnership and the Brixham Neighbourhood Forum all working together to deliver sports and recreation for the Brixham Peninsular.

The "Friends of the Commons" have now held several meetings and will shortly be drafting a long term management plan for the commons. Temporary measures have been partially successful in keeping the travellers out. Until then, we can only do our best to keep the travellers from getting onto the commons.

Neighbourhood Planning and YOU!

The recent decisions to pass applications for housing development on Scott's Meadow in Torquay and part of Churston Golf Course - both strongly resisted by local people - is a wake-up call for the importance of a water-tight Neighbourhood Plan that reflects local people's views. These are two unfortunate local examples of David Cameron's 'presumption in favour of development' as set out in the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) published in March this year.

Torbay Council is currently working on its new 'Local Plan', which will work alongside Neighbourhood Plans for Brixham, Paignton, and Torquay. The 'old' Local Plan is still live, but only until April 2013 when the NPPF will take precedence unless a new Local Plan is well advanced by then. Due to an under-supply of housing in Torbay as a whole, the NPPF already takes precedence over the Local Plan for housing proposals – as the Scotts Meadow and Churston Golf Course decisions show.

Key in the new Local Plan is an emphasis on Jobs. Housing needs for the Bay become subsidiary to this, and only as an adjunct to growth in employment. The Council and Community are exploring the potential for Brixham Peninsula to accommodate approximately 30 houses per year, or 600 homes in the 20 years of the new Plan, which is less than has been delivered over the last 10 years. In fact, no new sites need to be identified for housing for at least the next five years. There are already enough in the system that have planning permission, or have been allocated for housing in the existing Local Plan.

The Brixham Peninsula Neighbourhood Forum – charged with producing a Neighbourhood Plan for the area (that includes Galmpton) - has now reached the stage when statements are being drafted that reflect local views on a number of topics, as voiced in public meetings and in general questionnaires.

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However these statements will have no currency unless they:-

- are congruent with Torbay Council's Local Plan
- meet the legal criteria as set out in the NPPF document
- pass examination by an independent Examiner appointed by the Council
- are approved by 50% of local residents who take part in a referendum on the Local Plan, after it has passed Examination

Content in the Neighbourhood Plan has to be evidenced. This can come from a variety of sources such as referring to national, regional and local policies or - more importantly for such a Plan - from canvassing the views of local groups, businesses, and residents. When local opinion is being sought, evidence is more reliable statistically if based on the results of everyone having the opportunity to answer identical questions on specific topics with a choice of pre-selected answers. This is one way of gathering data that has statistical validity. GRA is imminently going to circulate a questionnaire to collect this type of data, based on the one that informed Brixham's Town Design Statement.

PLEASE DO NOT CONSIGN THE QUESTIONNAIRE TO THE BIN!

For those of you who have already given your views in other ways – thank you – but we now need to focus on the issues raised and have opinions in a form that are statistically sound and can undergo scrutiny.

Working recently with the Prince's Foundation, the Neighbourhood Forum has had a report and plans arising from the public meetings and workshop discussions in June. These, together with the questionnaire results will form the basis of an open day at the Village Institute in August/early September when we hope you will come and participate in 'Shaping Galmpton's Future'.

GRA committee members would be very happy to attend meetings of Galmpton village Clubs & Societies to give a short explanation on Neighbourhood Planning and help anyone with filling in the guestionnaire.

Residents Against Golf Club Sell-off R.A.G.S.

- On 7th June, Brixham Town Council Planning Committee considered the Golf Course Applications. RAGS and the Community Partnership addressed the meeting but Bloor Homes and the Golf Club declined. The Committee voted overwhelmingly against the Applications and advised the Torbay Planning Committee accordingly.
- Torbay Council Development Management Committee (DMC) held a
 Briefing Session on 12th June for which RAGS provided a comprehensive report detailing the reasons for refusal, and yet again, Bloor Homes
 and the Golf Club declined to attend.
- The Planning Hearing proper was held on the 25th June. The advice given to the Committee by the Planning Department was (unsurprisingly, to us!) in favour of the Applications.
- Residential Development on the 1st and 18th was considered first, and all Councillors who spoke stated that they were opposed to development. However, the Officers in attendance gave a forceful and biased account to the effect that rejection would cost the Council money in the event of legal action by Bloor Homes. At this the Committee's stance collapsed and Development was Approved by 5 votes to 3 (the Conservative group voting in favour).
- The proposed site for the Clubhouse was heard next and this Application was refused unanimously for a number of compelling reasons.
- The 2 Applications are inextricably linked such that one cannot proceed without the other and that if both are not approved Covenants against development on the 1st and 18th come back into force.
- RAGS has submitted the transcript of the Hearing for Legal scrutiny to ascertain if the decision made on the 1st and 18th is legitimate.
- Churston Golf Club has announced that the refusal for the Clubhouse site will be Appealed. If this Appeal is refused then development cannot take place unless an alternative location for the Clubhouse is found and approved, in which case a new Contract and Commercial arrangement will have to be agreed by Mayor Gordon Oliver (in the same way the original Deal was signed by Nick Bye).
- As we expected, RAGS campaign is set to run for quite a while yet.

Churston Golf Course

On 25th June, the Planning Committee voted to (i) approve the 132 houses on the 1st and 18th; and (ii) refuse the clubhouse on the AONB.

Taking the refusal, this success was assisted by the evidence of the specialist golf course consultant Mark Smith. His report was paid for by the CP and a copy is on our website. Far from "going bust" as claimed, Mr Smith found the club's financial performance in the top half of all UK golf clubs across the UK! The club had stated they will appeal, but their grounds to do so are limited and this seems unlikely.

On the housing approval, there is concern by representatives of the CP who attended the meeting on the way it was conducted. Planning officer advice to Councillors (i) on the Brixham Peninsular housing requirement substantially contradicted previous advice to the Prince's Foundation; and (ii) was incorrect as regards the way Planning Inspectorate is currently considering appeal decisions. This is a shame given previous controversy; how it is resolved is currently unclear.

Brokenbury

Given the Grammar School's work with the CP to enhance the sports facilities on existing school grounds (See **Page 7**) any previous case for a sports hub at Brokenbury has now further been reduced.

The CP's proposal for Brokenbury (5 building plots to fund the land for community use as a common/orchard and improve Broadsands Beach facilities. Separate expansion of the Farm Shop) has now twice been on the agenda for approval at a full council meeting and then been deferred. Cllr Pritchard has confirmed the Mayor and the Council would like Brokenbury to be considered through the Neighbourhood Plan process. This is taking place.

Windy Corner

Despite the CP having undertaken significant work to consult on the various schemes which the CP was informed would start this autumn, the Council has now decided to defer any work on the junction until 2015.

Neighbourhood Plan

Given the above, the importance of our area proceeding on a quick basis to bring forward a Neighbourhood Plan is more important than ever. Drafts of the plan will start appearing on our website. If you are interested in getting involved and having more of a say about your area please get in contact.
