THE GAZETTE Delivery in Jeopardy Still

I hope you value this magazine being delivered through your door every quarter by our excellent team of volunteers. There was a great response to my plea in the last issue, but a few other volunteers are now no longer able to distribute their rounds.

So, some roads risk losing this service unless someone can step forward.

The rounds at risk are in Galmpton Village and Churston Village, so if you live in either village, and are prepared to help out, then please contact me. It only involves about an hour, 4 times a year, delivering to 30 - 40 houses.

The alternative is residents living in those areas may have to collect their magazine from Churston Library or Galmpton Post Office.

For a short while, some of the existing volunteers are standing in and delivering those rounds, but that is not sustainable in the long term.

Residents' Associations in Jeopardy Too

Regular readers will be aware that the **Galmpton Residents' Association** has been operating without a Chairman on and off for many years, and is always appealing for new committee members (see **Page 19**). If you are keen to support their objectives then please contact one of their members.

It also appears that the **Broadsands & Elbury Residents' Association** now has no Chairman, Treasurer, nor Secretary, their committee has not met recently, and their web site no longer exists. So unless anyone knows different, their future existence is in jeopardy.

I also suspect that **Residents For Churston** is no longer active, now that the **Golf Club** and **Brokenbury** developments have been resolved.

That leaves the **Community Partnership** and ward **Councillors** as the primary remaining representatives of local residents. See **Pages 20 & 21** for further details, and please actively support their efforts.

During the summer the group has continued to work on securing the perimeter of the common to prevent unauthorised encampments. The boulders have been strengthened and the gate at Slade Lane was installed and locked during the high risk period. This work has appeared to pay off; much to everyone's relief there have been no problems since. Generally there has been positive feedback from local residents for these actions. During October volunteers plan to do some work managing the copses.

The group have discussed longer term issues and agreed that the boulders need to be seen as a medium term solution pending decisions regarding the road widening and impact of this on the common. The Slade Lane gate was agreed with the council as a temporary measure, pending approval from the Secretary of State for permanent measures to secure access from that direction. This process is now underway. The group will meet again early in 2016 to plan for next summer.

Brixham Peninsula Neighbourhood Plan (BPNP)

The draft Galmpton/Churston/Broadsands/Brixham reports have now been formally edited and amalgamated to produce the final draft BPNP, which is now nearing the state of final submission later this year. Reconciliation of the housing numbers between the BPNP & the Local Plan is still ongoing.

Friends of Galmpton Common

The gate erected at the entrance appears to have successfully restricted the incursions of travellers.

The views and knowledge of anyone with an interest in the history, ecology or other aspects of the common independent of the 'travellers' issue is greatly welcomed, as protective 'armoury' against the loss of common land in the proposed widening of the ring road, promoted by the current Mayor. The issue is due to be discussed in 2016. As the History Society's excellent display at the Gooseberry Pie Fair on Sunday 5th demonstrated, Galmpton Warborough Common is a culturally and environmentally significant - but increasingly threatened - resource.

GRA Subscriptions

This is our first article in **THE GAZETTE** since the Local Elections so we would like to take this opportunity to say a huge **Thank You** to everyone who supported us.

We are still working on a number of issues from last year; challenging the unlawful encampments on Churston Common, pursuing a 20-mph speed limit in Galmpton, safeguarding green spaces in Hookhills, and replanting trees in the ward.

There are huge challenges facing us all with the massive budget cuts the Council is facing. We need to cut the overall expenditure by another £33M within the next 3 years, on top of £42M cuts we have already had to make.

This of course puts **Churston Library** back in the limelight. Rest assured we are committed to continuing the library service in Churston, and are working with **The Friends of Churston Library** and fellow Councillors to reduce its running costs.

Update on the Covenant

By the time you read this Gazette, according to ClIr Mills and the Mayor's office, the Covenant to protect the Golf Course should have been registered with the Land Registry. In September, the Secretary of State wrote to the Council to endorse the decision made by the Mayor in December 2014. Since then the decision has been advertised in the Forward Plan. We hope this means the golf course is now finally protected for the benefit of both golfers and local people.

Neighbourhood Plan

Following the extensive Neighbourhood Plan consultation event which we ran at our AGM in August, and which we are grateful for so many of the community for having taken the time to attend, we have been able to make further progress on developing the main Plan Document and the supporting Evidence Documents.

The Council requires that we commence a formal 6 week consultation period on the Neighbourhood Plan by January 2016. We are working towards this deadline and expect to have completed the draft Plan by end of December.

'WILL' YOU OR WON'T YOU?

"Everyone knows we're together. It'll all come to you, anyway". "Oh, well that's okay then. We'll leave it for now. Do it when we're older, perhaps".

For the majority of the population, 'dying' may not be top of the list of things to consider too much while we are so busy 'living'. Furthermore, perhaps we don't like to have to think about it. Why should you make a Will?

Even if you do not consider yourself to be the wealthiest inhabitant in town, if you die without leaving a valid Will, certain rules will dictate how your 'Estate' (of possessions, money or property), should be allocated. Of course, those rules may distribute your goods and cash differently to the plan you had in mind!

If you are **not married** to your partner, or if you have not registered a civil partnership, you and you partner **cannot inherit** from each other unless a valid Will exists. Consequently, the death of one partner may create serious financial difficulties for the remaining partner.

If you have children, you will need to make a Will so that arrangements for the children can be made if either or both parents die.

It may be possible to reduce the amount of tax payable on inheritance if advice is sought in advance and a Will is made.

If your circumstances have changed, it is important that a Will is made to ensure your money and possessions are distributed as you wish. This is even more important if you have separated and your former partner lives with someone else now. In such circumstances, you may want to change your Will. If you re-marry, or enter in to a registered civil partnership, any previous Will becomes invalid, so it is vital to up-date it to ensure *your* wishes are carried out rather than the tax man's wishes!




