The Government plans to clamp down on religious extremism to prevent violence but it does not appear to recognise the vast difference between fundamental Christianity and fundamental Islam. Christ forbids the use of force in promoting the Christian religion. When Peter used his sword to resist the arrest of Jesus, Matthew recorded 'Then Jesus said to him, "Put your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword" Matthew 26 v52 (NKJV) When guestioned before Pilate, 'Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight." John 18 v36 (NKJV). The Christian is called to be a soldier but in a spiritual warfare against spiritual enemies. Paul writes 'For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood'. The Christian therefore needs spiritual armour and weapons. 'Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit... and for me that utterance may be given me, that I may open my mouth boldly that I may make known the mystery of the gospel...' see Ephesians 6 vv10-20(NKJV)

Because Christians are not prepared to use force to promote their religion some Muslims conclude that Christianity is weak and has resulted in the decadence of the West, but to become a true Christian a person must voluntarily accept Christ as their Lord and Saviour. As John wrote concerning Jesus 'He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name.' John 1v 11&12 (NKJV). Have you received Him as your Lord and Saviour?

Perfection

By the time you are reading this, Christmas and the New Year festivities will be dimmer in the memory and we will have been asking ourselves 'What will this New Year bring? Good news or bad?'

February is a time of year that some people find very difficult. The winter weather has been unpredictable and a bit miserable and tiring. The news of things going on around us, nationally and locally, seems equally unpredictable. The New Year resolution has already fallen by the wayside.

It can be a time of year when we do not always feel that great about ourselves. We can feel we have to strive to keep up appearances, to look good in the view of others, to look in control or more than competent; dare I say to be the perfect person. We can be afraid of failure and loss of face; too proud to admit we can't do it on our own.

God though doesn't see us that way. He calls us through baptism into a relationship with him. Through baptism he begins, if we will let him, to make us perfect in his eyes from that moment. "But I'm not perfect" I hear you say, "How could I be perfect in God's sight?" Let's face it we all have faults and I am no exception to that! So how can this be?

On baptism a process of sanctification (making holy) begins. God takes you as you are and says "I'm going to start working on you to make you perfect in my sight. It'll take you all of your life, but stick with me and we'll get there!"

What is required is to start the relationship, and once started to keep it going. That way, day by day, we become perfect in his sight. "What if I mess up?" Ask his forgiveness and he will pick you up and you continue your walk with him.

But then again, those who are baptised are no longer their own. They belong to Jesus Christ, and when the imperfect encounters the Perfector even the incredible can happen if we believe it can!

Brixham Peninsula Neighbourhood Plan (BPNP)

The Local Plan has been adopted, although work on the relationship of housing figures to current and likely future job availability continues since there is not a convincing correlation between projected housing figures and employment opportunities in the peninsula. Accommodating the inevitable associated traffic increase is an additional challenge to be resolved. Partly as a result of residents' response to the latest appeal to review the last modified Local Plan, proposed housing figures for the Brixham Peninsula have currently been reduced from 770 to 660. Only minor adjustments will be required to the Peninsula Neighbourhood Plans due to be submitted later this year.

Friends of Galmpton Common

The gate erected at the entrance appears to have successfully restricted the incursions of travellers.

Decisions on appropriate, practical and aesthetically acceptable marking of the common boundaries have yet to be finally determined.

GRA Subscriptions

Subscriptions of £3 are now due for collection. Many will already have been collected, while the remainder will be collected within the next couple of months. Subscriptions may be paid in at the Galmpton Post Office should this be more convenient.

Flood Prevention Scheme

Increasing rain and generally disrupted weather systems increase the urgency of flood prevention measures. GRA will be scheduling a public meeting to explain what their proposed scheme involves and with the guidance of a local expert in the field, encourage local volunteers to contribute to its success.

Future of GRA

If any resident would like to contribute particular interest or expertise to a specific area of Residents' Association work within areas such as local environment (including flood prevention), social or leisure provision, traffic issues, etc., please contact a committee member. Update on the Covenant

In the last **GAZETTE** we relayed information from our local Councillors that the covenant would be finalised at a meeting in November 2015. This did not happen. Rather, another group of Councillors successfully argued more information was needed. This information is being gathered, but the progress is disappointing.

Implementation of this covenant will mean the golf course cannot be developed without approval of the majority of the ward of Churston and Galmpton. There is already a covenant preventing development without approval of the Council. Whilst many think the golf course <u>cannot</u> be physically developed anyway (there have been now 5 failed planning attempts to relocate the clubhouse), others point to the waste of resources caused by continuing flawed planning applications.

The CP met with Mayor Gordon Oliver just after Christmas. He promised he would try and ensure the covenant was implemented as soon as possible.

Neighbourhood Development Plan

In the last **GAZETTE** we also set out that we expected to be able to consult on our neighbourhood plan in mid January. A small but committed group of unpaid volunteers from across the entire Brixham Peninsula have been working hard to navigate a mountain of complicated paperwork to finish the neighbourhood plan.

We are running a little behind, but the plan will soon be out for consultation and when it is please ensure you read it. The plan will be the key document which will manage how our area develops over the next 20 years so is very important.


