

The European referendum is to be held in June when individually we need to decide whether we want to remain in the European Union or leave it. This is not an easy decision to make, because there are advantages and disadvantages in whatever way we choose to vote.

However, in the spiritual realm there is an evil union, which each of us clearly needs to break, if we are to avoid catastrophic consequences. This is due to the fact that at the commencement of human history our first ancestor chose to reject the righteous reign of God and rebelliously submitted themselves to the oppressive reign of the devil or Satan. Today of course many people deny this and the very existence of Satan, but he does not mind this since an enemy undetected or denied can more easily gain his objective.

In scripture Satan is described as 'the prince of the power of the air (signifying he manipulates and influences those living on the earth), the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience' Ephesians 2v2 NKJV.

In another passage the apostle Paul wrote 'But even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, whose minds the god of this age has blinded, who do not believe, less the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ who is the image of God, should shine on them,' 2 Corinthians 4 v 3.4 NKJV.

Referendum

June 23rd is a day of decision; the referendum regarding whether the UK leaves the European Union or not. Of course, how you vote is your own judgement.

Writing in April, what interests me about the 'debate' so far is the nature of it. The debate centres less on the positive aspects of staying in or coming out, but rather on the fear of what will happen if we stay in or come out.

How curious, has it come to pass that we take important decisions in life with a greater eye to what we might lose, than what we might gain? We see in all kinds of ways, this idea of 'this is how we do things here' and the thought of change, even if shown to be beneficial, is not always welcome.

Often change comes through an irresistible development and we either adapt or we become stuck in our ways perhaps to our disadvantage. For instance, how many of us would never use a car to travel by? Yet there was a time when it was resisted fiercely! The same has happened with mobile phones, personal computers and the internet in modern times.

The church, of course, is not immune from this, whether it be the buildings or the style of worship or other issues of choice, there will be those who will hold on to something for fear of what change might look like.

Nostalgia is a wonderful thing for looking back, but we can forget difficult aspects of life. I was born in the late 50's and while seen by many as a golden age, we forget the Old Age Pension was introduced because it was considered most people would not live much beyond 70 years old anyway, such was life expectancy then. Would we really want to go back to that?

Jesus taught us two important things among others; that neither life nor death stands still, and not to fear, but to love; to love God, yes, and to love one-another, so we need not fear death, but understand it as the gateway to a new life, an eternal life with the Lord. This is the message of Easter, a life with Jesus or death without him.

In the great scheme of things then, important though it is, whether we stay or leave the EU is less important than how we live our life and this also is a matter of our own judgement.

The group met recently to review progress and actions needed for this year. Update on the Covenant

In the last **GAZETTE** we relayed information that the covenant we requested to protect the Golf Course was delayed by Councillors requesting more information.

This information was finally obtained in February 2016. However, on the very day the information finally turned up, Councillors (appear to have) removed powers from the Mayor so he can no longer make certain decisions on covenants.

Given the co-incidence in timing, this intervention appears directed towards stopping the Churston covenant. It is notable that several politicians including Conservatives, Lib Dems and Brixham Independents backed it.

Quite what the actual consequences will be is however unclear. The Community Partnership was previously advised in the Golf Course inquiry by a top Queens Counsel and other leading Barristers with the direct consequence we were successful. We will continue to ensure we are correctly advised going forward and hence consider this matter to be far from over.

It is however a shame that so much unnecessary resources continue to be tied up on this one issue when there are so many other issues which need addressing and the Council's own Planning Officers have stated clearly the site is "undeliverable".

Neighbourhood Development Plan

Our Brixham Peninsula Neighbourhood Plan will soon be out for consultation and when it is please ensure you read it. The plan will be <u>the key document</u> which will manage how our area develops over the next 20 years so is very important.




