A New Start in Life

Do you ever wish you could begin your life again with a clean slate? Every year people make New Year resolutions intending to change themselves so as to live differently but fail after a few weeks or even days. The reason for this is because we cannot fundamentally change ourselves and therefore alter our behaviour. Jeremiah the Prophet challenged his contemporaries, "Can the Ethiopian change his skin or the leopard its spots? Then may you also do good who are accustomed to do evil." Jer.13v23 (NKJV) This was not meant as a criticism of the colour of the Ethiopian's skin or the pattern of the leopard's spots but a graphic way of emphasising that what we are internally determines how we live morally and ethically.

The good news of the Christian Faith is that although we cannot effectively reform ourselves God can do it. The Apostle Paul stressed this when he wrote, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation: old things have passed away, behold, all things have become new". 2 Corinthians 5v17(NKJV) This means that when a person becomes a true Christian by acknowledging and forsaking their sin (or wrongdoing) and looks to Christ for pardon and forgiveness they experience a profound inner change. They have new views of God and His Word the Bible, of themselves and others, of the world, of life and death, of heaven and hell. Jesus emphasised this change when Nicodemus, a highly religious and moral man came to question Him and Jesus said to him, "Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again'." John 3v7 (NKJV) This means that just as we enter our earthly family through a physical birth, so to enter life in the Kingdom of God we must experience a spiritual birth. The first is through our parents the second is through the action of God. Have you experienced this profound inner change and know what it means to be born again?

Celebrating things scary and evil has nothing 'happy' about it and yet we seem to think nothing of putting our children through this stuff and even dressing them up in it. Does this give children and young people a skewed view of the world? There is surely enough trouble around as it is without making it look like a fun thing to do. The Greek New Testament word 'Makarioi' can be translated 'happy' and sometimes is in modern Bible translations, but it is more properly 'blessed'. Therefore when we are happy in the Lord, we are blessed by him. Hence those words written by country singer Bill Anderson and sung by Ken Dodd have a ring of truth to them; 'Happiness, happiness, the greatest gift that I possess, I thank the Lord I've been blessed with more than my share of happiness'. A very 'Happy' or rather 'Blessed' Christmas to you all!



After nearly 2 years without unauthorised encampments, the perimeter "defences" were breached in August, by a particularly aggressive and antisocial group. Because of the level of intimidation, reports to the police, and evidence of forced entry, they were moved on guite guickly.

It was clear the boulders needed to be reinforced, and we had urgent discussions about what could be done. Councillor Richard Haddock became aware of some large heavy concrete blocks for sale, which would be very difficult to move, and asked the "Friends" for a contribution towards the costs. Village Questionnaire Feedback

The GRA committee would like to thank everyone who attended the GRA stall at the Gooseberry Pie as well as the Village Open Meeting in July, and who provided us with feedback by returning a completed Questionnaire.

Forty-six completed questionnaires were received, of which 40 households raised traffic related concerns (89% of responses), 21 households raised environmental concerns (47% of responses), and 16 households raised flooding concerns (36% of responses). In addition, the responses highlighted some other general concerns, e.g. conservation of Common, risk of loss of green belt for development, not enough litter/dog bins, road safety issues at Windy Corner, and pedestrian pathways.

Given the large number of traffic related concerns, the GRA analysed those responses in detail as a priority. The following main headings emerged as the top 5 areas of concern:

- 1. Impact of Parking within the Village
- 2. Lack of a 20mph speed limit (village wide & school environment)
- 3. Impact of School traffic
- 4. Lack of Pedestrian facilities on a number of roads
- 5. Over/illegal use of Old Road by traffic other than for access

The GRA will now review these results in more detail with the local schools and various responsible bodies to see what can realistically be done to address these concerns. Additional analysis will also be done on other areas of traffic concern highlighted in the survey.

Update on the Covenant to Protect Churston Golf Course

In **THE GAZETTE** last time, we continued to advise readers that no progress had been made by the Council on the issue of the Golf Course covenant. Sadly, this still remains the case. In the period since August, the Community Partnership has sent five separate e-mails to ward councillors requesting a meeting with Council Officers to progress the issue. There has been no reply from Council Officers.

In the interim it would appear the Golf Club have come up with more proposals for new Golf Club house locations. It was announced at their general meeting in October that 3 new Club house locations had been considered:

- i. The farmland comprising Elberry Farm to the west of Elberry Cove and this was also said to have included a large hotel development as part of the plans;
- ii. Land at Brokenbury next to the SWW sewage treatment plant;
- iii. The back of the 1st and 18th holes next to Bascombe Road;

It is unclear how realistic these proposals are or how much support they enjoy from the wider Golf Club membership.

Neighbourhood Development Plan

Our Brixham Peninsula Neighbourhood Plan is getting very close to completion and it is hoped that it will be out for consultation around Christmas 2016.
