The Protestant Reformation was the biggest 'shake up' in the long history of the Christian Church. It was an endeavour to return to the original teaching of Christ that had become largely lost under centuries of church tradition. The resultant teaching was summarised under the 5 Solae of the Reformation. The second of these is 'sola fide' which means by faith alone.

This stresses the vital importance of faith and not our good works as the only way of Salvation. This may seem surprising since it goes contrary to popular religious belief. We all tend to think that God accepts good people and rejects bad people. Although this principle is basically correct the problem is that since man's disobedience and estrangement from God none of us can attain the standard of perfection that He requires. Therefore, another way must be found if any of us are to enjoy acceptance with God. That way is through Christ. He is the only one who fully met the standard of perfection that God requires, and He also suffered the just punishment that sin deserves. So, Salvation and the true blessing of God are found not through our efforts but through repentance from sin and faith in Christ. The Hymn writer Augustus Toplady expressed the way of Salvation in this way:

Rock of Ages, cleft for me,	Not the labour of my hands
Let me hide myself in Thee;	Can fulfil Thy law's demands;
Let the water and the blood,	Could my zeal no respite know,
From Thy riven side which flowed,	Could my tears forever flow,
Be of sin the double cure,	All for sin could not atone;
Cleanse me from its guilt and power.	Thou must save, and Thou alone.

Nothing in my hands I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling; Naked, come to Thee for dress; Helpless, look to Thee for grace; Foul, I to the fountain fly; Wash me, Saviour, or I die.

It's a Dog's Life

In Britain, in general we are very fond of our pets. I see many people out walking their dogs; it is good exercise for both pet and owner. When our pet dies, whether hound, horse or hamster, it can be as painful as losing any other family member.

In February 2011 our first dog, called Dilly, died. She was a German Shepherd/Lassie-type-thing cross aged over 15 years. Like any other pet she had her own special character including an uncanny ability to smile (really!). She was French, adopted, understood three different languages (French, English and Breton), had been kidnapped as a young dog and escaped, had a "doggie stroke" aged 12 which left her with a sideways view on life from then on, but she loved life, us and biscuits. Oh, and my roast dinner on my 43rd birthday.

We miss her very much still. But has she gone to some kind of doggie heaven or what? We do not know. The Bible tells us nothing about this subject. It tells us a lot about what humans can expect the other side of this life, but nothing about animals. The Bible's prime focus is about God's relationship with us and vice-versa.

Ascension Day is on 10th May. The Bible readings recall Jesus physically leaving us for the last time to go to his Father in Heaven, though he is still with us in a spiritual sense all the time. The Ascension is the final stage of Jesus' cycle of existence as a fully-fledged human being; being born, lived a life, died, resurrected and finally ascended from whence he came to live for ever with those who love him.

Sentiment apart, I cannot say if Dilly is heaven-bound or not; she was not capable of professing a faith in Jesus Christ, but she was one of God's creatures, had a sweet nature (I forgave her the roast dinner!) and gave us a lot of fun and laughter, and maybe that is enough.



Friends of Galmpton Warborough Common

We have reviewed our Short-Term measures and concluded that, following strengthening of the boulders last year, no extra reinforcement is currently needed. Our work group will strim, clear and define ditches in Bascombe Road and Langdon Lane, ensuring they are effective and clearly visible.

The Slade Lane gate will be locked until September.

We have collated the results of our Long-Term Plan priorities survey. 650 questionnaires were delivered to Galmpton Village and Bascombe Road area. We got 174 replies: 172 fully supported our approach, so the local community has given us the green light! The main comments were: the over-riding need to keep vehicles off; importance of ditches being well maintained and easily visible to prevent accidents; opposition to any more road widening on Dartmouth Road; and (most commonly) concerns about the dangers of walking on Langdon Lane without a path. Thanks go to everyone who replied, and especially to Gary & Kay at the Galleon Stores for acting as a collection point. The next step is to develop plans for the Brixham side of Langdon Lane with an all-weather natural path, and more in-depth consultation later in the year, when we will also hold our AGM. We will continue to liaise with the council and (given their support) are looking at using soil dug from the path to cover a lot of the boulders and blocks, creating a bund that will grass over, landscaping the remaining visible tops of boulders. This would keep the same level of protection whilst improving aesthetics and providing an area where wildflowers can flourish.

White Rock II Development Re-Advertisement of PA/2017/1133

We hope you received our messages about the re-advertisement of this Planning Application that occurred during the Easter holidays with very little publicity from Torbay Council. Over 400 people objected to the White Rock Development of 400 more houses, a primary school and a public house on the Ring Road at the southern side of White Rock. We advised those people to write again to the Planning Department to let them know that their views had not changed, and to ensure that a very strong demonstration of objection did not get discounted in the process of re-advertisement.

If you did not write in about this, either in March/April or last December, there is still time before the Planning Committee meets. The incalculable loss of high-grade agricultural land bordering an AONB surrounding the Dart river valley needs to be contested strongly as does the loss of quality of life of all communities encircling the area. Please address letters or emails to Angharad Williams, Case Officer, Torbay Planning Dept. Also, please encourage friends or neighbours who have not heard about this Application to write in as well. For more details, do get in touch with us.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Brixham and Paignton Neighbourhood Plans are currently being examined by a very suitable and experienced Examiner who had to be found independently of the Council. Reports from the Examiner will be presented soon and then we will be letting you know the next stage of the process including when the Plans will be the subject of a Referendum.

Galmpton Village Traffic

A member of our Committee and a Primary School Governor met recently with our Ward Councillors to explore possible funding of work to achieve improved adjustments in the village to help with traffic problems. Though Council money is limited, they said they would do their best to assist.

Community Partnership Churston, Galmpton & Broadsands

Neighbourhood Plans (NPs)

The good news is that Deborah McCann, an experienced NPIERS neighbourhood plan examiner, has been appointed to examine the Brixham and Paignton plans. The experienced NPIERS examiner Nigel McGurk is examining the Torquay plan.

Their appointments follow a failed bespoke Torbay Council procurement process over many months and Forums threatening to ask the Secretary of State to intervene. It is disappointing NPIERS was not used from the start as Forums asked. Examiners will consider the plans and the public comments submitted in the six week consultation ended 18th December 2017. They have also been asked by the Council to consider Council documents submitted on 11th April 2018 - 4 months late. By the time you read this there might be yet more Council late submissions!

This might appear more democratic if the Council's response actually reflected views of <u>elected councillors</u> rather than <u>unelected officers</u>. The Forums are keen to hear from elected Councillors and submitted a question to the whole Council on 22nd February 2018. Cllr Derek Mills as Executive Lead for Planning replied to the question and stated it would not be appropriate to consult elected councillors.

White Rock II (Inglewood) and Windy Corner Junction

The Brixham and Paignton Neighbourhood Plan forums attended a councillor briefing in March alongside seven Parish and Town Councils who also objected.

A key issue is traffic. The development proposes substantial changes to the Windy Corner junction which depart markedly from the agreed Council scheme residents were consulted on. Despite this, the junction fails capacity tests in the evening rush hour. That is before any account is taken of many hundreds of houses currently being built and hundreds more in the Neighbourhood Plan. Despite this the Council seems rather positive on the scheme.

National Media Headlines

All of this rather unconventional Council approach to planning has been picked up by <u>national</u> media. *Country Squire* magazine (countrysquire.co.uk) run regular features on Torbay and recent headlines include *"Council traumatises whole neighbourhood"* and *"Is Torbay Council corrupt?"*. They make interesting reading.

Power of Attorney

How do you make an article about **Power of Attorney** interesting? By telling your readers they can reclaim some money, of course!

So, do you have a **Power of Attorney**? If you answered '*Yes*', you may wish to continue reading. If you answered '*No*', perhaps that is something that we can help you with at a reasonable cost.

If you made a **Power of Attorney** between **1 April 2013** and **31 March 2017** and had the power registered, you could be entitled to a refund of part of the fee. However, you can claim only if your **Power of Attorney** was made in England or Wales and you must claim by **31 January 2021**.

Don't all rush to the Travel Agent at once because, while the refund of between $\pounds 34$ and $\pounds 54$ will not rank you among the wealthiest people in the UK, it might pay for a little treat somewhere. How much you'll receive depends on when you paid the fees. What's more, you'll receive 0.5% interest as well.

Even if you don't know when you paid the fees, you are entitled to claim a refund.

So, if you have, or think you have a **Power of Attorney** (either LPA or EPA) which was registered between the dates above, have a good old rummage to find the document, contact us and we can let you have details of how to claim.


