By Christ Alone

God used the Protestant Reformation to breathe new life into the Church. The reformers wanted to strip away centuries of tradition and to return to the original teachings of Christ and the Apostles.

The principal teachings of the Reformation were summarised under five Solae. These are five vital truths that define the Christian faith and should be held in their fullness. The fourth of them is Sola Christo, which means by Christ Alone. This means that Christ is absolutely essential if a person is to find salvation because salvation rests on the work of Christ alone. One way the Bible expresses this truth is by drawing a contrast between Adam and Christ. Adam as the first man was not just a private individual but also the first representative of the whole human race. By his disobedience to God's specific instruction he brought sin, condemnation and death upon us all. The Bible describes Christ as the second man and the last Adam teaching us that there is no representative of man between Adam and Christ and none after Christ. By His obedience to God's law Christ obtained righteousness, justification and life for all those He represents.

The message of the gospel is that by repenting of our sin toward God and believing in the atoning death of Christ and accepting Him as our Saviour we are taken out of our natural position 'in Adam' and are placed in the privileged position of being 'in Christ'. When this contrast between being 'in Adam' and being 'in Christ' is understood we can see new meaning in many passages of Scripture: e.g. Paul the Apostle wrote, '*For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.*' (Rom. 6:23 ESV) '*For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.*' (1Cor. 15:22 ESV)

When considering God's amazing grace towards unworthy sinners the Apostle also wrote, 'And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let him who boasts, boast in the Lord." (1Cor. 1:30-31 ESV)

The important question is, how does God see you? Are you still 'in Adam' or have you trusted Christ for salvation so that God now sees you as being 'in Christ'?

Such conflicts now stand as a reminder that there is surely a better way of settling disputes than taking up arms, if peace can be sought.



The Brixham local policing team is shown along with Contact policing team buttons to leave a message. We were assured crimes, incidents & concerns would be dealt with this way. It was reassuring to hear that a programme for training additional Special Constables is starting soon, so we should see more of these very valuable assets in our area hopefully within the next 6 months.

Another year has passed successfully in terms of maintaining the perimeter securely and encouraging the natural environment. After two years without incursions, the bats are back and there was a good show of wild orchids. We have continued to maintain the ditches and deal with any weak spots liable to vehicle incursion. We have had positive feedback from many local residents and dog walkers. Thank you everyone. This year, in discussion with the commoner, we agreed to leave uncut strips round the perimeter to give a wildlife meadow area for flora & fauna to flourish. We welcome your feedback about this in anticipation of next summer. We held a successful AGM in September; electing a full committee; updating people about the work done; and the state of the long-term plan. We are still awaiting the OK from the council to get on with developing a bund and path down Langdon Lane. Councillor Mills has agreed to chase the council officers.

Some residents have asked us about the concrete blocks on the car park. These were placed by the Community Partnership after an attempt to force the gate with a vehicle and chains. FOGWC understand the council has no plans to open the car park in the foreseeable future and we have informed them that this is a concern to local people and visitors alike.

GRA Committee ~ At our AGM in September a new Committee was elected with Jeremy Harrington Partridge and Christine Batten re-elected as Chair and Secretary respectively, and with Ian Sharratt taking over as Treasurer. Other Committee members are Piet Dijkshoorn, Peter Hughes, Jennifer Lee, Joan Mazundar, and Emma Tolton. We look forward to keeping everyone informed about any issues affecting village life.

Traffic Steering Group ~ The AGM also set up a Traffic Steering Group to specifically look at the volume and speed of traffic in the village. Progress to date includes:

Traffic Wardens will be visiting both schools once a month to monitor peak times parents bring/collect their children etc. If you see a TW please let us know so we can monitor this is actually happening and if you have time to see what is going on, some feedback would be welcomed. It would also be useful to give some specific pointers to the TW concerning parking on blind bends, ends of roads, etc, which in turn make it difficult for cars to pass.

Churston Grammar School have responded to our request for a meeting to discuss traffic problems in the village with a view to working together to improve matters. We have a meeting planned in early November.

National Trust also responded, and we are arranging a meeting shortly.

Galmpton Primary School have yet to sort out a date for a meeting.

Herald Express Reporter met us in October to build our story of concerns about traffic problems. We hope to use this to keep villagers informed.

We are also looking into the increase in traffic cutting through the village, especially when the Windy Corner roadworks start in 2019.

WE NEED YOU! We want to compile evidence to illustrate the problems experienced by villagers. This will be used in a variety of ways and to give Galmpton a voice again. If you have a specific traffic problem or concerns, had a near accident as a motorist, pedestrian or cyclist, please send details to our Email address above. Neighbourhood Plans (NPs)

The Examiners report on the NP was published on 26th July 2018. A copy is available on the Forum website: **www.brixhampeninsula.com**

One issue is Policy E4 on report pages 47 to 49. Churston Golf Course was designated in the NP as Local Green Space to give it protection. However, following Council lobbying, the Examiner recommended this protection should <u>not</u> apply to the 1st and 18th holes. The Examiner's reasons are somewhat unclear, but there is some suggestion of developing housing on the 1st and 18th instead.

The NP Forum are making representations to the Council that the 1st and 18th should be protected and a specialist government NP advisor is now assisting.

The final decision is to be made by Torbay Council at a public meeting held on 15th November at 5:30 pm in the RICC. If you have views on this, please contact your two ward councillors: Di Stubley and Derek Mills (contact info on **Page 18**).

White Rock II (Inglewood)

The CP can update on the progress of the development, as we are advised a planning committee date is no longer imminent and the developer may seek to bring forward the site in the next Local Plan review in December 2019. Given the strategic nature of the site given its size, this is understandable.

Travellers / Unauthorised Encampments

Following the summer encampments on Paignton Green, there appears to be recognition that Unauthorised Encampments are a bay wide issue. Locally, the tremendous work of people from all across our community has been invaluable in protecting the Common. However, there now appears an opportunity to consider whether the Council's existing policy on Unauthorised Encampments is the best; i.e. likely whether it uses the quickest and cheapest options available.

The Community Partnership is hosting a discussion meeting on 1^{st} November to consider this. We hope to have leading Councillors, Council Officers, and outside consultants present – and all are welcome.


