The fifth and final Sola or key teaching of the Reformation, which was a movement that sought to re-establish the original message of the Christian Faith, is 'Soli Deo Gloria' which means glory to God alone. This stresses the fact that the authentic Christian Gospel about Salvation when faithfully proclaimed and received inevitably brings glory to God alone. This enables us to distinguish the difference between true and false Christianity. False Christianity has arisen because sin has so corrupted every area of our lives that we are now totally self-centred so that everything must revolve around us. Consequently, false Christianity panders to this self-centredness where the needs of its adherents become paramount and God is then relegated so that He becomes subservient to their desires and expectations. This reverses the order of true Christianity where the glory of God is the primary goal and our needs are secondary.

In Salvation, God takes the initiative. He so loved us that He sent His Son to save us from our sins through His bitter sufferings on the Cross. In this way He delivers us from the just punishment that our sins deserve in Hell. This was an act of sovereign grace, so that the Apostle Paul wrote in contrast to the futile boasting of false teachers. "But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." Galatians 6.14 (ESV). It is God who reveals to us the infinite worth of Christ's sacrifice. God also gives us faith in Christ and enables us to repent of our sins and receive forgiveness and reconciliation with Himself. He enables us to persevere and to finally reach Heaven. From start to finish Salvation is all of grace and therefore it rightfully brings glory to God alone.

It is this Gospel that we seek to proclaim, and you are sincerely invited to join us on Sunday mornings at 10:30 am.

## **Community Partnership**Churston, Galmpton & Broadsands

#### **Neighbourhood Plans (NPs)**

At a public meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> November, Torbay Councillors resolved to make modifications to the submitted Brixham Peninsula Neighbourhood Plan.

Councillors agreed with the Community that the 1<sup>st</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> holes of Churston Golf Course should be designated as Local Green Space. This gives the land long term protection against development. The designation does not apply to the car park and clubhouse, thus allowing any future Golf Course expansion proposals. This is a very welcome and positive outcome.

Councillors also agreed with the Community that the land between Galmpton and Paignton, should be rejected for housing, identified as outside the settlement boundary, and designated a 'settlement gap'. This has obvious consequences for any development proposals relating to that land.

The Neighbourhood Plan now goes forward to a Referendum on 2<sup>nd</sup> May. This will be your chance to have your say. If the majority of Brixham Peninsula voters support it, the plan will be adopted as a policy document by the Council.

#### **Ward Councillors / Local Elections**

Our current ward councillors are standing down at the local elections on 2<sup>nd</sup> May.

Two members of the current Community Partnership committee have already been selected by one of the political parties as ward Councillor candidates and we wish them well. Other candidates will likely come forward in due course.

#### **Travellers / Unauthorised Encampments**

The Community Partnership discussion meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> November was well attended by the Community and various senior Council Officers and Councillors. A number of action points were identified by the meeting, including how the use of Civil Enforcement powers (i.e. Bailiffs) should be part of the Council's overall strategy for dealing with unauthorised encampments. Discussions are continuing between the Community Partnership and the Council on this issue.
