Should Christianity be for private use only?

Within the Christian community there seems to be an unhealthy individualism that is detrimental to the true nature and function of the local Church. What I mean is that some believers are content to keep their Christian faith largely to themselves or a small circle of Christians or friends. This practice fails to recognise the importance of the local Church as the place where local Christians should regularly meet to encourage one another and receive instruction from those gifted to teach the Word of God.

It is true that we individually become Christians by personally turning to Christ for forgiveness and acceptance with God. Nicodemus a respected Jewish leader and teacher was clearly told this when Jesus answered him 'Truly, truly, I say to you unless one is born again he cannot see the Kingdom of God.' John 3v3 ESV.' What Jesus meant was that just as we enter our earthly family by physical birth, so in a similar manner to enter God's family, we need a spiritual birth. This takes place when we recognise our sinfulness and turn to Christ for forgiveness and acceptance with God. Jesus died as the guiltless One in the place of the guilty to make that forgiveness possible for us. When we take this step, we experience a change that can be described as a spiritual birth. In this way we become members of God's family and belong to the Church.

The Apostle Paul likened the Church to the human body when he wrote, 'For the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body", that would not make it any less a part of the body.' 1Corinthians 12 v14 &15.ESV. Later in verse 21 he wrote, 'The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you", nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you."

As Christians we need the help and support of each other to reach maturity. We develop our spiritual gifts by using them and the local Church is the primary place where this should take place.

I suspect not, because it is a way of living rather than a job, and one never really stops living it, though in lan's case he will doubtless find more time to do the things he wants to do, like fixing his motorbikes, and listening to his collection of blues records. But even these things allow one to find the presence of God in a different and everyday situation.

I should like to wish Ian and Liz every blessing and enjoyment in their new situation in life, though I would be surprised if this is the last we will see of them. If there is one thing about the Brixham area I have learned it is that once lived and loved, it stays part of you. I am sure you will join me in wishing Ian and Liz all the very best for the future.
