



Hello, my name is Gill Knight, and I would like to introduce myself as the new Community Builder for Galmpton, Churston, Hookhills & Broadsands, following in the very large shoes of Suzie who has returned up north to her roots and family. I wish her luck and good fortune in her new life in Cheshire.

I am not new to Galmpton, having previously lived in the village for several years, so it was nice to be re-introduced to members of the community who I knew already, or who I recognise by sight, and I look forward to working with new and old acquaintances over the next few months.

This role however is now only half time, as I will be spending the other half of my week working on a new community initiative called Staying Put, a project designed to use volunteers and neighbourly support to help with small tasks to enable older people to feel comfortable and able to stay in their homes for longer.

Staying Put is a broad project working in partnership across the bay with five other local service providers, offering small task DIY and gardening support through Yes Brixham; Cooking buddies for those who need some help and guidance with cooking and shopping; through the Ellacombe Partnership, a volunteer advocacy service where a volunteer will help you express your opinions when you feel unable to do so alone; through seAp, a health navigator service helping people to find their way through the health and social care system when needed with Healthwatch Torbay; and more general support by way of befriending, neighbourly support, help with tasks like decluttering and turning the mattress; small jobs that make a difference through the Aging Well Team. Obviously with a new project it is a little chicken and egg, we want to offer services, but need the volunteers to do so, however we now have a few volunteers to get the project started, but are always looking for more who might have occasional or more regular time to offer. Please get in touch, as you all have skills to offer!

I look forward to meeting more of the residents of Galmpton (If I haven't already met you at the fantastic Autumn Festival), and please feel free to contact me if you have any ideas or need any help with future projects.

The First Commandment

We would like to thank the large number of people who attended our **AGM** in September where lots of concerns/ideas were exchanged with regard to attaining and preserving a good quality of life in our village.

We are in conversation with Torbay Councillors with regard to achieving a *20-mph speed limit* on village roads and although Torbay's budget seems to have demoted the proposition in their priority list, this will continue.

Similarly, we are monitoring the experience of residents when using the *Windy Corner junction* – in particular, provision for pedestrians, ease of or difficulty in accessing or leaving both Galmpton and Churston and the very bright, high lighting which is causing distress for nearby residents. The lighting is also seriously detrimental to wildlife such as the endangered Greater Horseshoe Bat as the Common is a principle flight path for them. Torbay Council have agreed to carry out an audit of the effects of this road alteration at the end of October which we will be actively following.

Please note the Community Partnership comments on *Town Councils* and the *Neighbourhood Plan* opposite. These two points are clearly linked since, if our villages are subsumed into either Brixham or Paignton Town Councils, our strong voice on planning issues, such as White Rock 2, will be very much diluted, with perhaps two Town Councillors (votes) amid a much larger number. The alternatives of either no Town Council or a separate Parish Council would do much to avoid this.

First Joint Meeting with Brixham – September 10th saw circa 70 people pack out the meeting room at Brixham Rugby Club with great numbers coming from the “Villages” – thanks to all who turned up. Let’s keep the engagement going for future meetings! There were short presentations on the *NHS Community Led Support* and *Torbay Over Fifties Assembly [TOFA]*.

However, the meeting focused on:

Torbay Governance Review [Town Council Proposals] – New Head of Planning, Andy England, summarised the Council’s proposals to create Town Councils in Paignton and Torquay, similar to that in Brixham. This will raise extra rates per household [“precept”] to keep local services going which may well be otherwise axed due to a financial crisis at Torbay Town Hall. A “consultation” closed on 25th October which invited residents of Churston with Galmpton to choose to join up with Paignton or Brixham. Many residents will have been sent a message highlighting the existence of an alternative choice – a Parish Council. The CP Steering Group will be offering to conduct, on behalf of the Council, a more relevant survey for the “Villages”, adding the choice of a standalone Parish Council before any decisions are made, as it is felt that teaming up with either of the adjoining towns won’t necessarily work. Many present were only dimly aware of these proposals, and mostly unaware of any Parish Council option.

Torbay Council Climate Crisis Strategy - Time only permitted a short and very lively discussion on this, and the whole subject was carried forward to future meeting(s).

Neighbourhood Plan – Adoption of this for the Peninsula is being monitored closely, with a wary eye on the “refresh” due by 2021 at the Torbay Council end.

A meeting on 1st November is due at the time of writing to welcome Sarah Wollaston – that should be interesting!
